### SUMMER ADVOCACY & PROGRAM **UPDATE**



The Arc's summer has been a period of intense and effective action. Our team has been working tirelessly on both state and federal policy initiatives, while also expanding our vital community programs. Our efforts have been focused on addressing critical issues affecting the disability community.

#### STATE AND FEDERAL POLICY INITIATIVES

On the state level, we have made significant progress with our legislative agenda. Several of our priority bills have successfully moved through hearings, with some already passing out of committee.

These bills have passed the Senate and are awaiting a vote in the House:

- "An Act facilitating better interactions between police officers and persons with autism spectrum disorder" (Blue Envelope)
- "An Act dignifying individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities" (Archaic Language)

Through a supplemental budget amendment, these bills became law:

- "An Act relative to affirming and maintaining equal access to public education for all children" (Education Protections)
- "An Act relative to affirming and maintaining equal access to public education for all children" (IEP Interpreters)

At the federal level, we are collaborating with our advocacy partners to pursue a bipartisan exemption for human services workers with Temporary Protected Status (TPS). This is a critical issue, as potential changes could exacerbate the existing workforce shortage and limit access to essential services.

To strengthen our voice, The Arc is also leading a statewide advocacy working group to present a unified message to our lawmakers and administration. Federal funding cuts pose a threat to our entire community, and it is imperative that we unite to maximize our impact.



#### **ADVANCING HEALTH EQUITY**

Our Operation House Call (OHC) program continues to expand its reach. This summer, the OHC team provided training to 170 Harvard medical and dental students. These students are now participating in home visits with our host families, providing them with a transformative, real-world learning experience.

As one dental student who recently completed their home visit wrote, "Spending time with F. and their family member gave me insight I never could have read from a textbook or learned through a video. Being there, interacting in person, gave me a tangible example of incredible compassion that will never leave me. Learning more about the specific needs and adjustments that provide stability for this family was so beneficial for my future time caring for patients. I hope that I can exemplify the attributes I learned from this family."

This fall, the OHC team will be following up with the Harvard dental students and teaching an intensive course for the Harvard School of Dental Medicine. Oral healthcare disparities are a growing concern within our community. Many dental practices claim they are "not equipped" to treat patients with autism and other disabilities, leading to long waitlists, especially for adults. The shortage of MassHealth dental providers and limited access to operating rooms further compound this issue.

#### A NEW ERA AT THE ARC OF **MASSACHUSETTS**

The Arc of Massachusetts enthusiastically embarked on a new era with a change in leadership in 2024. After a remarkable decade of leading The Arc's Government Affairs and Operation House Call program, Maura Sullivan was appointed Chief Executive Officer in November 2024. As CEO, Maura will leverage The Arc's existing expertise to raise its profile as a thought leader in disability both in the state and nationally. This exciting transition came upon the well-deserved retirement of greatly respected Executive Director Leo Sarkissian, who dedicated an incredible 33 years of service to leading the organization.

#### **EMPOWERMENT AND ADVOCACY**

#### Fiscal Year 2025 State Budget and Other **Budget Decisions**

The state budget is one of the most important bills that moves through the legislature each year. A multi-billion-dollar spending plan, the budget also includes important policy provisions. The Arc is strategically engaged throughout the entire process from advocating for our priorities before the Governor's version is proposed to filing amendments in both the House of Representatives and Senate – until the

Governor signs it. During the House debate and the Senate debate, we work to advance several policy priorities.

In August 2024, Governor Maura Healey signed the FY25 budget. It included historic investments in the human services workforce, bringing the median pay average for direct support professionals to \$20 per hour, an approximate 20% increase in wages. Many key areas of the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) budget received significant funding increases to match the growing needs of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and autism. In addition, proposed cuts to Personal Care Attendant (PCA) funding were halted, and funding was secured for Operation House Call and an Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Training pilot. Accessory dwelling units (ADUs), a long-time priority of The Arc, were signed into law through Governor Healey's Affordable Homes Act.

#### Fiscal Year 2026 State Budget

The Arc collaborated with advocacy partners on workforce initiatives and met with dozens of lawmakers and administrative leaders. Maura traveled across the state to engage and empower advocates. The Government Affairs team trained over 600 community members. We mobilized over 2,000 advocates who contacted their legislators in support of key amendments, which resulted in the inclusion of all of The Arc's budget priorities in the final FY26 state budget, including:

- \$31 million to continue operations at Pappas Rehabilitation Hospital for Children while the hospital's future is determined. Maura also serves on the Pappas working group.
- \$5 million for the Massachusetts Inclusive Concurrent Enrollment Initiative (MAICEI), ensuring access to higher education for

- students with IDD and autism. The Arc led the bill that established MAICEI and has consistently pushed for adequate funding.
- \$150,000 for Operation House Call.
- \$75,000 to fund training for mobile crisis first responders on how to appropriately and effectively respond to individuals with autism and IDD in the community. This amendment came directly from the work of our Government Affairs Committee.

Even in this economically challenging fiscal year, we fought to keep funding for critical DDS line items relatively consistent. While more funding is needed to meet growing needs and to make progress on the workforce crisis, our advocacy helped to fortify services and supports for the community.

#### 2025-2026 Bill Platform

The Arc's Government Affairs team conducted a priority-setting survey prior to the 194th legislative session that began in January 2025. Nearly 600 members of The Arc community responded, identifying what policy issues and proposed legislation they were most concerned about. The Arc then developed a priority bill platform with 14 bills divided into three categories: Uplifting the Workforce; Health Equity; and Community Inclusion and Empowerment. The Arc endorsed an additional 15 bills, which we work closely with our partners on. Information about all current bills can be found at thearcofmass.org/bills.

#### **State Advocacy Activities**

In January, The Arc held an orientation for newly elected legislators and their staff to educate them about the top issues facing the IDD and autism community and shared the critical work of The Arc. On the same day, The Arc held the first ever legislative briefing on profound autism, at which Maura facilitated an eyeopening panel discussion in front of an overflow crowd. After this event, The Arc launched a campaign for families to share their own stories with their legislators.

A record-breaking 600-plus advocates attended "Safeguarding Our Rights through Advocacy," the 47th Annual Legislative Reception hosted by The Arc and the Massachusetts Developmental Disabilities Council in March. Senator Robyn Kennedy and Representative Sean Garballey were honored. Parent advocate and direct care provider Peter Wyman and his daughter gave a moving keynote speech and Maura engaged the room of lawmakers and community members with a powerful call to action.

In April, over 350 advocates joined The Arc and Advocates for Autism of Massachusetts (AFAM) for the 20th Annual Autism Advocacy Day, "Advocating for Rights and Opportunities across the Spectrum of Need." Senator Cindy Friedman and Representative Christine Barber were honored. Parent advocate Amit Basak received a standing ovation for his keynote speech. Maura and Katie Terino, the Chair of the AFAM Executive Committee, announced a formal partnership and introduced a new AFAM logo that highlights our united commitment to autism advocacy.

The Massachusetts Alliance for 21st Century Policy (MA21) educated community members on the new Self-Direction regulations

and continued its advocacy for improved experiences in self-determination. The committee hosts recurring meetings that engage participants in affecting change in the DDS implementation of self-directed services as outlined in the Real Lives Law.

#### **Federal Advocacy Activities**

Leading up to the 2024 elections, The Arc coordinated #TheArcVotes voting advocacy campaign, which included two webinars, a series of interviews with self-advocates about the importance of voting, a social media campaign, an e-newsletter miniseries, and frequent updates to our online voting webpage.

In January, The Arc hosted a virtual forum with state leaders to discuss how they are preparing for the new presidential administration. The Arc produced fact sheets and marketing campaigns highlighting issues of importance to our community, particularly those targeted by potential cuts to Medicaid and the Department

of Education. More information can be found at thearcofmass.org/policy.

To gauge the impact of Executive Orders, The Arc launched the Community Check-In Survey in March. Nearly 600 individuals responded, with almost 25% indicating they had already been affected. The top areas of concern were cuts to Medicaid and Social Security. Hundreds of personal stories were collected and shared with our congressional delegation.

In April, Director of Government Affairs and Strategic Partnerships Nora Bent led a delegation of 70 disability advocates from Massachusetts at the Disability Policy Seminar in Washington, D.C. The Massachusetts group, one of the largest among the more than 900 advocates from across the country, met with all members of the state's congressional delegation or their staff and strongly advocated against budget cuts, Executive Orders, and policy changes that would be devastating to the disability community. In response to federal

cuts, Maura has formed a state-wide advocacy leadership task force. The task force is working in unity on critical communications to our state lawmakers.

#### **CELEBRATING THE "WITH ALL** YOUR HEART" WORKFORCE RECRUITMENT CAMPAIGN

The Arc of Massachusetts received a \$1.635 million federal grant for a workforce recruitment program to address the critical shortage of direct support professionals (DSPs) who care for individuals with IDD and autism. Launched in March, the statewide campaign increased awareness of DSP roles and the positive impact they have on the community. Candidates were encouraged to apply for positions with The Arc's 17 chapters through a centralized recruitment hub.

The campaign redefined perceptions of DSP work, highlighting its human value, and attracting qualified applicants. Advertising

was placed on billboards, in convenience and grocery stores, and in quick service restaurants and laundromats, as well as on social media and online. The campaign's impact extended beyond workforce recruitment by providing the public a rare look into the lives of adults with disabilities. The campaign increased The Arc's brand recognition by a remarkable 29%.

We are deeply grateful to Senators Elizabeth Warren and Ed Markey for their support and partnership, which made this much-needed campaign possible. More information can be found at workforthearc.org.

#### **EDUCATION AND OUTREACH**

The Education and Outreach team has established a new tracking system to monitor information and referral inquiries, allowing The Arc to stay informed about issues facing the community and how to best respond to needs as they arise. The team has fielded over 350 family support referrals through this new

system. Planning is underway for the next Transition Conference in Fall 2026. The Arc also offered over 30 webinars; topics included advocacy priorities, MassHealth, DDS services, and Individual Support Plans.

The Arc relaunched our fee-for-service SUPPORTbrokers program. With grant funding, brokers have also been assisting individuals from marginalized communities who need greater support as they navigate services and systems.

OHC trained residents at Boston Medical Center; students studying physical therapy and rehabilitation sciences at Northeastern University; and attendees of a sold-out "Inclusive Dental Care: Patients with Autism and Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities" session at the Yankee Dental Congress.

OHC has been featured in several medical journals and publications in the last year,

#### **EQUITY INITIATIVES**

#### **Operation House Call**

Operation House Call (OHC) reached over 1,300 students at all major Massachusetts medical schools and several graduate nursing schools. The program has expanded to teach dental students at Harvard School of Dental Medicine and is working closely with Tufts School of Dental Medicine. In addition to regular classes at seven schools,

including The Journal of the American Medical Association, Helen: The Journal of Human Exceptionality, and Medscape. The OHC team is near completion of a state certification program for participating medical schools through the Department of Public Health (DPH). In partnership with DPH, OHC launched an outcomes survey to provide important data for certification and gauge the program's impact on students. Respondents to date have indicated that the program was a very meaningful experience that positively changed their approach to patient care.

Maura has been working on a national level to influence training mandates. She was invited to join other national healthcare education leaders to share the OHC model at the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Summit in Chicago. OHC is collaborating with The Arc of the United States to develop curriculum for medical education

that brings awareness of sexual violence against people with autism and IDD.

#### **Pathways to Friendship**

Pathways to Friendship has been actively providing training across the state, particularly for community organizations and schools. The program has built relationships with the Massachusetts Library Network and Best Buddies International. A partnership with North Quabbin Citizen Advocacy continues, with bi-monthly Friendship Matchmaking Forums. The Pathways team also held statewide symposiums and regional inclusion summits.

Pathways awarded eight Community Bridging Grants to organizations implementing community programs that are fully inclusive and bring people with and without disabilities together. Grant recipients presented their projects at a symposium in June.

#### The Leo Sarkissian New Initiatives Fund

The Sarkissian New Initiatives Fund was created to honor the legacy of former Executive Director Leo Sarkissian. The Fund fosters forward-thinking programs for families with loved ones who have IDD and autism as they confront key life events. The inaugural program After I'm Gone is developing solutions for families and self-advocates as they address one of the most challenging and emotionally fraught questions: what happens to a loved one with IDD or autism when a primary caregiver is no longer able to fill that role?

Led by Leo in his new role as Innovation Development Director, After I'm Gone will provide families critical tools, resources,

and guidance to ensure their loved ones are supported and secure in the future. This initiative will help families navigate complex planning processes related to housing, financial planning, and long-term care, offering peace of mind and practical solutions.

#### **Connecting with Our Community**

The Arc of Massachusetts is engaging more supporters and advocates in our work to enhance the lives of people with IDD and autism. At the end of June, our combined social media audience was just over 19,500 and nearly 23,000 email subscribers. Over the course of the year, the number of advocates who had registered to take part in our campaigns rose to nearly 39,000. Website traffic increased by 21% compared to the previous fiscal year.





## THE ARC OF MASSACHUSETTS MARCHES

#### WITH OVER 1,400 ADVOCATES AT THE ADA35 BOSTON RALLY

The ADA35 Boston march and rally on July 23, 2025 drew over 1,400 advocates, including over 130 who registered with The Arc directly and representatives from dozens of disability-focused organizations from across the Commonwealth.

Organized by a coalition of Massachusetts disability organizations, this event was a tremendous show of strength from the disability community in Massachusetts. Advocates came together to celebrate the 35th Anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) while advocating for change and the protection of disability rights during these uncertain times.

The Arc's CEO Maura Sullivan spoke at the end of the event, providing a rousing call to action for all attendees and encouraging them to take part in The Arc's newly launched advocacy campaign. Following the event, nearly 800 advocates completed The Arc's ADA-inspired action alert, urging Governor Healey to protect Medicaid, Home and Community Based Services, and the rights enacted by the ADA.

We are in this fight together - and we are here to stay!

They were joined by colleagues from The Arc of the United States and The Arc of Indiana to educate state lawmakers, staff, and advocates from across the country about the importance of Medicaid and home and community-based services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and autism. Sharing information about how vital Medicaid-funded services are, particularly for those with IDD and autism, is more important than ever, as states will face increasingly constrained budgets and will be forced to make difficult financial choices.

Emilia graduated from the University of Maryland, where she received a Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy. Emilia centered her coursework and research around developing policies that better meet the needs of marginalized communities. Alongside his wife Mary Lou, Bill co-founded the Disability Policy Consortium (DPC) of Massachusetts and served as its Executive Director from 2003 to 2010. **Don Stewart**, past President of the Board of The Arc of Massachusetts, passed away on July 19, 2025. As President from 1997-2000, Don played a key role in advocacy and strategic planning. During that period, The Arc combined litigation with ongoing legislative advocacy, which resulted in thousands of adults with developmental disabilities in the Commonwealth receiving services. In addition to his leadership, Don and his wife Elizabeth have been generous supporters of The Arc. He is survived by his wife Elizabeth, three children, and grandchildren. 
